## Speaker Biographies



Graduate of The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston and Oklahoma City University, completed a geriatric long-term care administrator preceptorship at the Arkansas Health Center and post-graduate training in developmental dentistry for adults at the Underwood and Lee Clinic in Louisville, KY affiliated with the University Of Louisville School Of Dentistry. He is a past President of the American Academy of Developmental Medicine and Dentistry (AADMD) and current Vice-President of Education for the AADMD.



Dr. Evan Spivack graduated from the University of Maryland dental school, completed residency training at St. Barnabas Hospital in the Bronx and a fellowship in special care dentistry at Helen Hayes Hospital in West Haverstraw, NY. He is currently a professor and leader of the Special Care Treatment Center at the Rutgers School of Dental Medicine.



Dr. Brooke has always enjoyed working with people who have disabilities. One summer during college she worked as a caregiver at a summer camp for kids who had disabilities. She enjoyed her rotation at the Lee Specialty Clinic while she was at the University Of Louisville School Of Dentistry and chose to do her externship with them. She has completed multiple continuing education courses in Special Care Dentistry and earned her fellowship with the Special Care Dentistry Association. She is an active member of the Special Care Dental Association, The American Academy of Developmental Medicine and Dentistry, and is the founder and president of the Special Care Dentists of Idaho.



Tamer Marzouk obtained his DDS degree in 2012 at Cairo University in Egypt. Since his graduation he has completed 2 years of general practice residency and 3 years of pediatric dentistry residency at Cairo University, the Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, and a fellowship in pediatric dentistry at the University of Washington, a fellowship in community dentistry and a clerkship in pediatric dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health.



As the Chief Scientific Officer, Dr. Hendrix directs scientific initiatives for LuMind IDSC. A critical element of his role is to establish the nationwide Down Syndrome – Clinical Trial Network (DS-CTN) and to oversee the first clinical trial in the DS-CTN, the Longitudinal Investigation for Enhancing Down Syndrome Research (LIFE-DSR) Study. The LIFE-DSR study is a natural history study focused on adults 25 years of age and older at high risk for Alzheimer's disease. Dr. Hendrix is also focused on building potential collaborations with industry, academic and government scientists focused on Down syndrome research to maximize LuMind IDSC's scientific impact.

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
